

Dyalog for macOS UI Guide

Dyalog for macOS comes with Ride prepackaged as its default interface. If you prefer to use Dyalog for macOS in a terminal window, you can use the TTY interface instead.

NOTE: Dyalog for macOS in a TTY interface requires the fonts and keyboard maps to be installed – see https://www.dyalog.com/apl-font-keyboard.htm

To start Dyalog with Ride

1. See the Dyalog for macOS Installation and Configuration Guide (chapter 5).

To start Dyalog with the TTY interface

- Open the **Terminal** application. The command line interface is displayed (default shell).
- 2. Enter the following at the prompt:
 - % /Applications/Dyalog-19.0.app/Contents/Resources/Dyalog/mapl A Dyalog session will start using the TTY interface.

TIP: If you don't want to type this every time you want to start Dyalog, create an alias in your preferred shell's configuration file by entering

% alias dyalog=/Applications/Dyalog-19.0.app/Contents/Resources/Dyalog/mapl A Dyalog session can now be started from your preferred shell by entering dyalog.
